The pattern parquet floor was originally derived from European Baroque period, in the 17th century. At that time, the mosaic was a royal imperial product, used to decorate the walls and the ground, and was popular in European palaces.



Among them, as the ultimate fan of pattern parquet floor - the French Louis XIV, the marble floor of the Palace of Versailles was replaced by pattern parquet floor, which made the Palace of Versailles a royal foundation that combines art and dignity.


